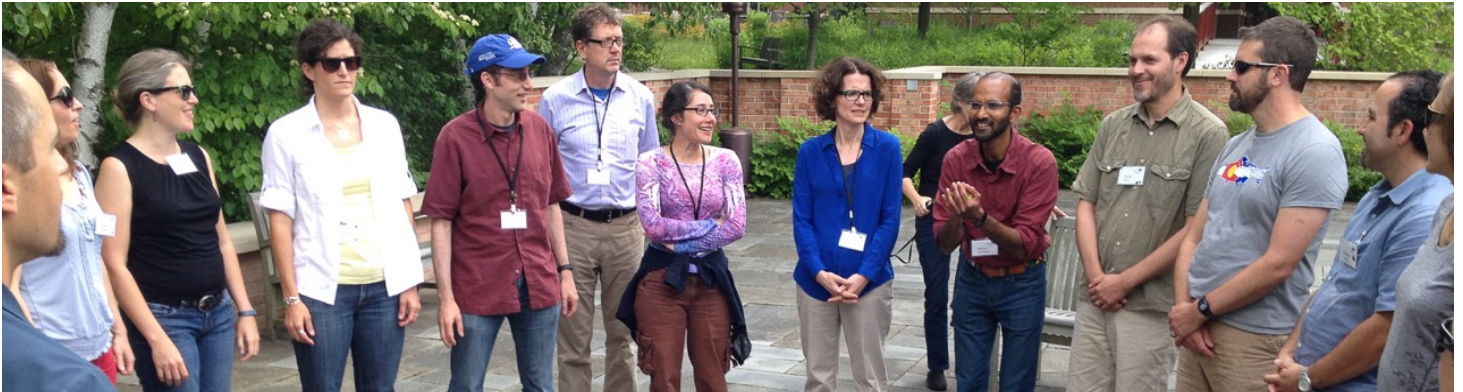


Leadership Teach-In: May 29-31, 2018 @ U. of Minnesota
